

## **Cultivate the Garden Within: Capital Improvements**





Your contributions to our parish help maintain the facility, making it the center of prayer in our community. Last year, I sent you our State of the Parish Report, which provided detailed information about how we are working to grow support for our faith community and facilities. It highlighted that over the last three years, we completed combining the partner parish offices at Saint

Ambrose rectory, replacing the cracked and unlevel sidewalks and front steps, improving the lighting in church, fixing the water problems and replacing the floor in the social hall and kitchen, and improving some of the landscaping. This year we hope to get the outside of the church windows painted and fix the plaster problems on the church ceiling and in the choir loft.
